
Increase the number of people who live within a mile walk of a park or trail to 80%

Healthy trees mean healthier people.

Over the next 50 years, these trees will

- Remove **544,991.33** lbs of air pollution particles
- Prevent 465,534.90 gallons of rainfall runoff and intercept1,920,699.40 gallons of rainfall
- Sequester **542,886.50** lbs of carbon
- **65,725.70** lbs of CO₂ Avoided
- **1,746.83** lbs of O₃ Removed

- **12.69** lbs of NO₂ Avoided
- **249.18** lbs of NO₂ Removed
- **121.02** lbs SO₂ Avoided
- **14.88** lbs SO₂ Removed

- **\$61,202** in Cumulative Benefits




For every \$1 invested in planting trees, a \$2 return in economic benefit is seen.
















Improving the health of cities and people through the transformative power of trees.
